American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State (ALABGS) is designed to train future stateswomen in the science of government and to develop their leadership skills. The program has grown to over 700 citizens yearly and continues to be a major project of the Department of Wisconsin's American Legion Auxiliary. This program does not discriminate against race, creed or color.

PURPOSE

- To develop leadership skills
- To instill pride as American citizens
- To educate citizens about our system of government
- To instill a greater understanding of American traditions
- To stimulate a desire to maintain our democratic government process

WHAT IS BADGER GIRLS STATE?

The entire delegation will become a fifty-first state and will function according to the laws of the State of Wisconsin. Each day will focus on the various aspects of state government.

Citizens "learn by doing" as they function on city, county, and state levels by electing officials in the manner prescribed by regular election procedures and conducting business on those levels. Every girl is encouraged to participate in some level of the governmental process. ALABGS should not be confused with recreational or sport programs.

ALABGS government and leadership conference is designed to educate the citizen on the function of government. Each citizen has been selected by her school and the local Unit. She should come prepared to apply herself diligently to the program as it is scheduled.

SPONSORS/TUITION

The American Legion Auxiliary sponsors the ALABGS Program through the support of the American Legion Family (Legion, SAL, Legion Riders), civic organizations, service clubs, businesses, and school groups. Financial contributions may pay all or part of a citizen's tuition. The tuition fee covers housing, meals, and study materials but not transportation.

GIRLS STATE HISTORY



The Girls State program was organized as a national Americanism activity by the 1937 National Convention. The first Girls Nation session was held in Washington D.C. in 1947. The program is a practical application of Americanism and good citizenship. The entire program is a non-partisan, non-political attempt to teach and instill in the youth of America a love of God and country.

Wisconsin launched American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State in 1941 with 138 citizens participating.

The American Legion Auxiliary is working to keep patriotism a part of the education of every child, patriotism that teaches love of America through knowledge of how our state governments operate.

The legacy from those Auxiliary members who chartered the first Girls State remains. The lessons learned at American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State enable these young ladies to become more informed citizens in how their state government functions.



CANDIDATE ELIGIBILITY

American Legion Auxiliary Units and local high school educators work together to select girls to attend American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State by evaluating potential leadership qualities of the delegates. Prospective delegates <u>must meet all of the</u> <u>following criteria</u> before being considered a candidate to attend American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State:

- 1. Be enrolled in the junior year of a Wisconsin public, parochial or private high school or home school whether the candidate resides in Wisconsin or a neighboring state.
- 2. Be interested in government and citizenship.
- 3. Be academically eligible and recommended by their school to participate.
- 4. Have outstanding qualities of leadership, good moral character, cooperativeness, dependability and participation in extracurricular activities.
- 5. Fitness (walk about 6 miles a day)

HEALTH

The week at American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State is strenuous-requiring emotional stability and physical stamina - with much cross-campus movement and long hours of group activity.

ALABGS ORIENTATION

Delegates, alternates, parents, school personnel and Auxiliary members are strongly recommended to watch the orientation video. There will be online question and answer sessions (in the spring) where parents and delegates can ask questions the orientation did not answer. Session dates will be posted to the alabgs.org website.

VISITORS

Parents, friends, contributors and sponsors are invited to attend the Opening Assembly on Sunday, the Inauguration on Thursday (followed by a reception), Careers and College Fair and the final General Assembly on Friday.

American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State is held beginning the third Sunday of June at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh campus. Delegates are housed in the Gruenhagen Conference Center and all meetings are held in various campus buildings.
